### Committee Reports

#### Treasury

- Ryan Morgan received a payment from Maura Deering and two from My World Dance.
- Re: the request from Bill to pay a \$50 fee to the Seattle Community Council Federation. Don't have record of ever paying this fee. Ask Chris Lyman (sp?) to come talk at a meeting to tell us what they are up to and how they can help us. Maybe ask for a scholarship if we can't be members otherwise.
- Newsletter revenue: No newsletter for September. Still trying to figure out how to get software inexpensively.
- Cary and Margo will be contacting new businesses about advertising – Immortal Dog, Charlie's BBQ, the Deli at 18<sup>th</sup> and Jackson, Cheeky Café, Moonlight, Hidmo, @ Café.

#### Traffic

- 20<sup>th</sup> and Lane complete. Follow-up on getting a speed sign that reports individual speeds to drivers.
- Issues with the intersection of Dearborn and Hiawatha. Allows a little treacherous rounding the corner in a car or bike, on bike route.

#### Community Outreach

- Cary is working on a blog template and encourages other JPCC members to provide content.

#### Crime

- Vince read David Brewster's statistical analysis of Seattle (comparing it to San Francisco). 19% of households have children, 55% not married, 31% have lived here less than five years and 31% are old-timers.
- Wendy reports that she has seen the police stop guys with carts full of metal 3 or 4 times in previous weeks. Some progress maybe being made on metal disappearing from the neighborhood.

#### Land Use

- 17<sup>th</sup> and Jackson on the southeast corner – development plan including businesses and housing.
- 20<sup>th</sup> and Jackson – purchased by Low Housing (something – LeeHi?) for low income seniors. It won't be built for 3 years. They are asking for assistance to come up with something that can make the spot engaging in the meantime. Some concern in the group that this project doesn't include businesses on main level – discuss with the organization?

### Community Improvement

- Alex looked into Judkins Park events – IMOJA Festival, Pacific something?, May Day March
- Talked about investigating movies as city has projects and other activities in Judkins – rummage sale?

### Plans for Quarterly Meeting

- Get someone from WinWin to come talk about the various initiatives – Alex will coordinate
- Ask George Staggers to talk about the Jackson Street BIA – Ryan Curran will coordinate.
- Someone from LeeHi (sp?) to help brainstorm ideas for what to do with the space at 20<sup>th</sup> and Jackson for the 3 years before the senior housing gets built. – Ryan Curran will coordinate.
