Cary Davis said that he had put together a Jackson Place blog and that it is ready for content. He has connections to Stranger slog and we can talk to [centraldistrictnews.org](http://centraldistrictnews.org) for ideas of how to best utilize blog.

Ryan Morgan noted that crime in the neighborhood is primarily panhandlers, with some drug use and thief of metal. Some discussion about the Recycle Depot and its purchase of scrap metal. Cary is going to call the recycling place to make sure they are following procedure and documenting who is getting reimbursed for the metal. Jenna at the Artist Lofts and Christa from Café Weekend concerned about this issue.

Goodwill is proposing demolition of buildings along Dearborn Ave. to make room for more trucks. The comment period has been extended. This is a temporary use of the space until a more comprehensive redevelopment plan materializes.

Cary Davis talked about Streets for All Campaign that supports walk, bike, ride public transportation and is working to push the city council to allocate funds to the endeavor. **Ryan Curran** is going to write an endorsement letter for the project for JPCC.

Business Association Initiative (BAI) in the works for Jackson from 20<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup>. Ryan Morgan would like to see the businesses from 14<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> added to this group. Seattle Vocational Institute still needs to sign the BAI. **Ryan Curran** is going to write a letter urging SVI to do so from the JPCC. BAIs helped the University District improve walkability – by cleaning up the streets and increasing police presence.

Susan Rose gave a history of the Traffic Calming efforts. SDOT shot down JP proposal for stop signs at 20<sup>th</sup> and Lane, and going down Charles, wouldn't block streets (worries about emergency personnel), or narrowing to a single lane. On Davis Place, people DYIed a traffic bump but SDOT ordered it removed. Ryan Curran suggested something a la the Intersection Repair, popular in Portland, where people create spaces that slow cars down – with big barrels, public art, community kiosks, benches, and in one place a solar-powered tea house. Some talk about the intersection at Jackson around 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>. Crosswalk but very little protections for pedestrians or bikers.

Discussion/Brainstorming about Goals for the following Year:

1. Monthly clean-ups: coordinated by Alex
2. Events in Judkins Park: **Alex** going to contact Seattle Department of Parks to find out usage of park currently. More events such as Shakespeare In the Park – both organizing and attracting events. Cary going to further investigate movies in the park.
3. Vacant Lot Revitalization: P-Patches – investigating how to get funding, etc. Ideas of where we could focus: 930 20<sup>th</sup> Ave, Weller @ Rainier, 20<sup>th</sup> where it turns into Judkins by the park, Hiawatha next to the Oil Company (owned by warehouse behind it).
4. Cleaning sidewalks – getting the blackberry bushes trimmed back throughout the neighborhood – walkability.
5. Tackling the Feral Cats problem...
6. Supporting Neighborhood Businesses – helping them get the word out about their business, offering support in ways that are helpful to them.

Tops priorities: Events in Judkins Park, Vacant Lot Revitalization, and Supporting businesses.
